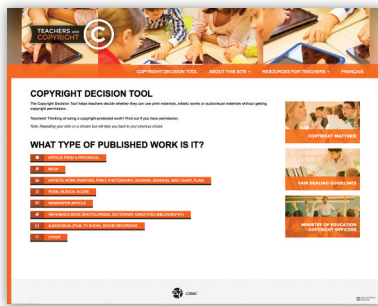


Copyright and Fair Dealing Reference Materials For Principals and Teachers



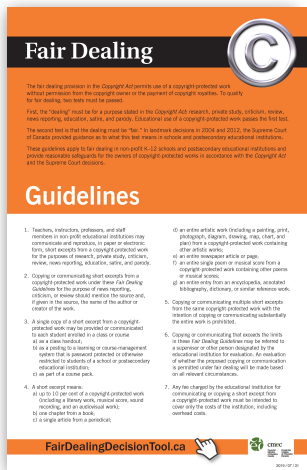
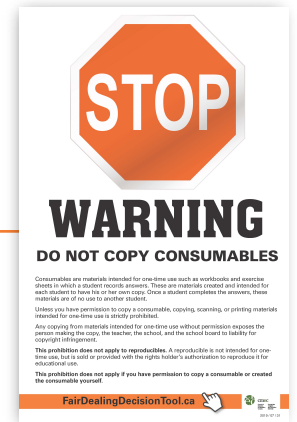
The fair dealing provision in Canada's copyright law permits teachers to copy and communicate short excerpts from copyright-protected works provided the dealing is "fair." The *Fair Dealing Guidelines* describe what is fair. These guidelines must be followed to prevent copyright infringement.

To help teachers better understand and comply with the copyright law, there are useful reference materials available online.



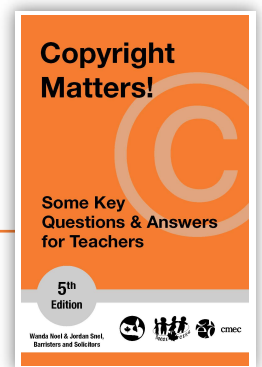
